Whereas the late Commissioners of Property by their warrant bearing date the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of November A.D. 1717. Did authorize and require the then Surveyor General to survey unto Martin Kuridigg and Hans Heer the Quantity of five thousand acres of land in several tracts among the late surveys made on Conestoga and Pequea Creeks, in Pursuance whereof there was surveyed on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May A.D. 1718 on a branch of little Conestoga Creek in the County of Lancaster unto the sd Martin Kuridigg and Hans Heer in part of the said quantity one tract containing two hundred acres & the usual allowance for roads. The right whereof the sd Martin & Hans having granted to John Witmore the said tract is limited and bounded as followeth To say, Beginning at a white oak in a line of Andreas Coffman's land, thence by vacant land West South West two hundred and fourteen perches to a Hickory, thence part by vacant land and part by land of Christian Poolman north two hundred & twelve perches to a Hickory, thence by the same land & by land of Henry Pace east north east one hundred & thirty four perches to a post, thence by the said Andreas Coffman's land south south east one hundred and ninety five perches to the place of beginning. Returned unto the Secretary's office the 30<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1735.
