Resurveyed for John Bowls one tract of land lying on the west side of Scoul creek beginning at a marked oak by the side of a branch by Scoulcreek side being the marked corner tree of Swan Lums land and from thence running N. W. 80 perches to a marked red oak from thence N. N. W. by a line of marked trees 280 perches to a black oak from thence S.S.W. 65 perches to a marked red oak then S. W. 145 perches to a marked white oak and from thence E.S.E. by a line of marked trees 320 perches to the Scoulcreek side and along the sd creek on severall courses to the first marked oak containing 400 acres
Also a small island near adjacent, containing two acres.

Resurveyed for John Bowls on piece of marsh or meadow lying on the west side of Scoul creek back in the woods being at the head of mill creek and beginning at a marked white oak standing near a run then ~~00 degrees~~ 24 perches to a marked dead oak, then N. 40 degrees E 20 perches to a marked white oak then N 50 degrees W ~~18 (pb1)~~ to a marked dead oak from thence N.W. 65 perches to a marked white oak then S. 65 W 18 perches to a marked white oak then S 15° E 50 perches to the first mentioned (pb1) white oak containing 10 acres.
