


Endorsement on Back

In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 4th day of August A.D. 1849 Surveyed the 14th day of August A.D. 1849 unto George, M. Tatham the above mentioned Tract of land being part of Windmill Island situate in the River Delaware in the County of Philadelphia Opposite the City of Philadelphia, which lies South of or below the Canal cut through the said Island from East to West by the Camden and Philadelphia Steamboat Ferry Company (which Canal is nearly Opposite Walnut Street in the City of Philadelphia) The said part of the Island being bounded on the north by the said Canal and on the South, East and West by the low water mark of the River Delaware. (Excepting only out of this application a lot of Two hundred feet front extending across the Island between parallel lines now in the possession of ---- Walls and formerly claimed by John Church.) Beginning at low water mark of the River Delaware and on the Southerly side of the Canal of the Camden and Philadelphia Steamboat Ferry Company thence along low water mark of said River S. 16° E. 9.63 Perches to a Corner thence by the same S. 7° 10' W. 45.4 Perches to a Corner, thence by the same S. 15° 55' W. 47.7 Perches to a Corner of land in possession of ---- Walls formerly Claimed by John Church, thence by the Northerly line of the said land in possession of the said ---- Walls N. 89° 20' W. 23.55 Perches to a Corner at low water mark on the Westerly side of said Island, thence still by low water mark of said River N. 4° 25' E. 58.12 Perches to a Corner thence by the same N. 7° E. 52 Perches to the Southerly side of the above mentioned Canal and thence by the Southerly side of the said Canal S. 71 1/2 E. 30.28 Perches to the place of Beginning Containing 20 acres and 47 Perches. Also all that part of said Island which lies South of the said lot in possession of said ---- Walls formerly claimed by John Church Beginning at low water mark of said River at a Corner of said Walls lot, thence along low water mark of said River S. 3° 25' W. 20.5 Perches to a Corner thence by the same N. 38° 55' W. 26.55 Perches to a Corner of said Walls lot and thence by the Southerly line of the said Walls lot S. 89° 20' E. 17.9 Perches to the place of Beginning Containing one acre and twenty three perches.
