

Whereas a warrant bearing date the 29th day of November 1787 in favor of Isaac Haines & Companions was granted & directed to George Churchman to Resurvey the Lands in said warrant mentioned & above described which by him was Executed but not returned, I do hereby Certify that upon an Examination of the Survey, above mentioned twenty in Number, I find them regularly made and quantity ascertained situate in the Township of East & West Nottingham in the County of Chester, North East Creek being a Division between said Townships East Nottingham lying on the East & West Nottingham on the West of said Creek.

The o.b.l. issuance of a Warrant granted by the Commissioners of Property for our former worthy Proprietor William Penn bearing Date in the year 1701, to the o.b.l. Applicants there in named vizt Cornelius Empson & his associates, a large Tract of Land situate between the Waters of Eliz River and Susquehanna cont o.b.l. rds Empson & his associates, was Surveyed & divided into Parcels called Lots, about 37 in Number it being Situate near the Line of Maryland by chiefly o.b.l. being Patented; and Whereas the settlement of the Line which runs West, between Pennsylvania & Maryland the greater Part of the said Original Tract o.b.l. aited fell to the Southward of that Line into Maryland On the Application of the Possessors of other parts of said Lots which remained in Pennsyl^a a Warrant was g.o.b.l. bearing Date the 29th of November 1787, unto Isaac Haines & Companions for resurveying & ascertaining the Bounds & Quantities of the seperate parts according the o.b.l. they were then held by the Possessors In Pursuance of which warrant, this is to Certify that in the year 1788 the same was resurveyed & the seperate Parcels are in Consequence were o.b.l. in & by the above Draught vizt to the said Isaac Haines & 13 other Persons adjacent, or whose Lands lay o.b.l. vious beginning at the West End, and to Thomas Scott Jeremiah Brown, John H. o.b.l. Philip Tanner at the East End.
