


A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in the Long Swamp Township in the County of Berks in the State of Pennsylvania Containing Forty Six acres and 150 Perches of Land, together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads Now belonging to Philip Basters - Being Part of a Tract of 108 acres and 146 Perches of Land et allowance That was formerly Surveyed to Samuel Burger By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble. Proprietaries of the 14<sup>th</sup> November Anno-1744, Who by his Agreement of the 16<sup>th</sup> January 1769 Sold his Right to the above Tract to the said Philip Basters - and the remainder to Jacob Long Divided for them on the 24<sup>th</sup> February Anno-1763 - and now Resurveyed on the 3<sup>rd</sup> September Anno-1781, in Pursuance of a Warrant of Resurvey and by Order of the Surveyor General, dated on the 22<sup>nd</sup> August Anno-1781.
