



The above is a connected draught of the land belonging to the heirs of William Crawford deceased (that part of Alice Crawford's tract contained within the black line amounting to 269 & 10 perches) allowance, and that part of William Crawford's tract contained within the red lines (exclusive of John Crawford's 100 acres) containing 230 A. amounting together to 469 acres & 10 perches situated in Cumberland connected for the purpose of having the same included in one Patent granted to Henry Russel one of the heirs of the aforesaid William Crawford deceased.
