


NUMBER SEVENTY ONE

In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> of June 1772 a Survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> of July following of a certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Sunbury in the Co<sup>r</sup>t of Northumber<sup>l</sup> being numbered in the general plan of said Town Eighty containing<sup>g</sup> in Breadth North and South Fifty seven feet Six inches  $\frac{1}{2}$  in length East and West two hundred and thirty feet bounded Westward by Broadway, Northward by Lot number Seventy nine Eastward by River Alley and Southward by Gooseberry Alley ~~as~~ by the general Plan of said Town remaining in the Surveyor General's Office will appear
