The above is a draft & of a tract of land copied and corrected from a draft and calculation filed in my office in the handwriting of John McClean dec'd in the words following to wit. "Situate on the waters of Redstone creek in Union township Fayette County and Surveyed the day of in pursuance of a warrant dated the day of This land has been improved at least 40 years; there is a Grist mill, sawmill, dwelling house, out houses, and an orchard on the same now occupied by Isaac Hutchinson who claims the land and at whose particular request the Return is made in the above form. Mr Hutchinson says he will forward vouchers of his right in the land described in the Cook warrant including the whole of the 255 as 145 P.
