


Low Ground



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of February, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, entitled an Act "for directing the Mode of distributing the the Donation Lands, promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth," and by Order of the Surveyor General, with the approbation of the Honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 22nd Day of September one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, the above described Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and Allowance for Roads, &c. No. 442 situate in District No. III, on the West Side of the Alligany River, in the County of Westmoreland
