



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of June.  
Anno Dom 1738. The Above Described Tract of Land Was Surveyed Into  
Jacob Good on a Branch of Muddy Creek in The County of Lancaster.

Begining at a Hickory at a Corner of Christian Good's Land Thence North  
80 Degrees West by Vacant Land 70 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South 63 De-  
grees West by the said Land 220 perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence South  
27 Degrees East by the same 58 perches to a Post. Thence South East by  
the Settlement of Francis Echart 94 perches to a Post. Thence East by  
South by the same 50 perches to a Post. Thence North 50 Degrees East by Vo-  
cant Land 100 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 2 Degrees West by the  
Same 40 perches to a post. Thence North 30 Degrees East by the Land of  
Christian Good 12 perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence up a run on the Several Cour-  
ses thereof 124 per. to ye place of Begining. Containing Two Hundred and Eight acres  
Beside ye Allowance of Six p. Cent.
