



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the twenty first day of April 1794 granted to Martin Fiss was surveyed on the tenth day of July A.D. 1817 The above described tract of land containing 401 acres 142 perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. situated in Fallowfield township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, Samuel Henry was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of twenty acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between Joseph Clark and the said Samuel Henry
