The Draught of a Tract of Land Called - Situate on Penn. Creek in the County of Northumberland. Containing Eighty Three Acres & Ten perches with the usual Allowance of Six Acres per Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 22^d Day of May Anno Dom. 1770. In Pursuance of a Warrent to Sam^l Hunter Sen^r for 150 Acres Bearing date at Philadelphia the 2^d Day of July Anno Dom. 1762.

The first Survey made on the north side of the Creek contained 239.9 156.7^a were cut off by M^r Richardson and returned (as I am informed) by M^r Evans in pursuance of a late Warrant and M^r Hunter claims Land over the Creek to file his Warrant.
