adjoins Benedict Rennels.

The above is a draught of a survey made June 7th 1816, in pursuance of a warrant granted
Samuel Hughes for 120 acres, dated December 7th 1813, situate on the waters of Chartiers
creek, in Straban township, Washington County, containing one hundred and twelve
acres and Sixty-eight perches with the usual allowance. This tract has been improved
since April 1st 1813, and a constant resident settlement kept up ever since - there are no
opposing claims whatever. In consequence of this survey having been frequently returned
on my hands, it has been resurveyed not long since, and the contents found as above,
being nearly the same as before. I have understood that Benedict Rennels has ent-
ered a Caveat against it, but he declared to me not long since, that he had altogether
given up his claim. You readily see that the boundaries are not precisely the same
that are specified in the application, as is frequently the case, the exact boundary
not being known at the time of application. Should you not be pleased with this return, I con-
fess I know not how to make one more satisfactory, as there is no person contending for the
land.
