



By virtue of a Warrant granted to William Horn requiring the Surveyor General to resurvey or cause to be resurveyed to the said Horn, a certain Tract of Land which (with other land) was surveyed in right of the original purchase of Jacob Falmer. And in pursuance of a warrant from the Surveyor General under the seal of his Office, authorising me to resurvey the said Land, both of which warrants are dated the 14<sup>th</sup> of September A.D. 1768.  
I have resurveyed unto the said William Horn the above described Tract of Land situated in the Township of Providence in Philadelphia County  
Containing Sixty seven acres and One hundred and fifteen perches without the allowance, this 15<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1768.
