a Tract of Land situated in the Township of Salford in the County of Philadelphia.
Beginning at a Hickory Tree bearing a corner of Christopher Hawk-
abrant's land thence by ^{the} same North west two hundred & twenty six
perches to a Hickory Sapling another corner of ^{the} s^t. Hawkabrant's land,
thence by Vacant land North East one hundred & fifty perches to a
white Oak marked for a corner, thence by Vacant land S. E. 150
South East two hundred & twenty six perches to a post, thence by
Vacant land and land of of Derick Johnson South west one hundred
& fifty perches to ^{the} place of Beginning containing two hundred
acres with usual allowance.
