



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed on the twenty-seventh day
of March Anno Domini 1738 to David Hay a Tract of Land situated in
the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at
a White Oak Standing on the side of Sickasawung Creek, thence
west 114 perches to a White Oak, thence North by west 180 perches to
a White Oak, thence west 120 per to a Black Oak, thence Southwest
by South 140 perches to a post, thence South 100 perches to a White
Oak, thence South 30 deg East 160 perches to an Elm standing
by the side of the afo^d. Creek, thence up the s^e Creek five hundred
& ninety perches to the place of beginning, containing four hundred
& sixty three acres and the allowance of six acres pacent for
Roads & highways.
