



By virtue of a warrant dated the fourth day of June anno domini 1743 The  
above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Nicholas Holdeman in County  
of Chester, in Chester County. Beginning at a White Oak at a corner of  
Over Thomas's Land ~~Heirs~~ East North East by the same 162 perches to a White Oak,  
hence North North East by D<sup>o</sup> and Jacob Dederiller 90 per to a stone, North 50 degrees  
west by Vacant Land 95 per to a stone, thence west northwest by D<sup>o</sup> 84 per to a Chestnut  
thence North 83 degrees west 80 per to a White Oak thence South Southwest 20 per.  
to a white Oak, thence West by S<sup>d</sup> L<sup>d</sup> M<sup>d</sup> H<sup>d</sup> perches to a Black Oak, thence South South East  
and John Shetter  
East by Joseph Thomas 256 per to the place of Beginning, containing two hundred and  
fifty eight acres. beside the allowance of six per cent.
