



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Seventh day of March 1733. Surveyed unto John Leonard Hyde a tract of Land situate in Oley in the County of Philad.<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a Lind tree a corner of John Hoy's Land thence by the same North west one hundred and sixty perches to a post. thence by Vacant Land North East two hundred and twelve perches to a corner stone, thence by Vacant South East one hundred and sixty perches to a post. thence by Vacant and Land of Edward Widners. South west two hundred and twelve perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning. Containing two Hundred acres with y<sup>e</sup> usual allowance of six p<sup>er</sup>ch.
