



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Prop<sup>rs</sup> dated the first day of March 1734 Surveyed to David Howell on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April then next ensuing the above described Tract of Land, Situate in Whiteland in Chester County, Containing Sixty eight acres and the usual allowance for Roads.

On the above land a Grist Mill is erected and the s<sup>d</sup> David Howell's right to the Land is sold to Rich<sup>d</sup> Thomas who has a right to three fourths of the s<sup>d</sup> Mill and Daniel Worthington having a right to one fourth, it is judged he paying a fourth part of the Consideration money ought to have a deed for 1/4 part, to w<sup>ch</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> R. Thomas agrees & promises to make him such a Deed upon such payment, in the mean time the s<sup>d</sup> land is confirmed by Patent to the s<sup>d</sup> Rich<sup>d</sup> Thomas.
