



Henry Spengler's Settlement

In Pursuance of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the sixteenth day of October A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>i</sup> 1735 Surveyed unto George Haagh a certain tract of land situate on a Branch of Tulpehocken Creek called the Noor<sup>o</sup> Hill, or Creek, in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a post set for a corner by Henry Spengler's Settlement thence extending by o-b-l East One hundred and sixty pches to a white oak marked thence by Vacant Land North one hundred and fifty nine pches to a post West one hundred and sixty pches to a post thence South one hundred and fifty nine pches to the Place of Beginning Containing one hundred and fifty acres and the usual allowance of six P Cent Surveyed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of October A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>i</sup> 1735
