



A Draught of a tract of land called \_\_\_\_\_ situate on a small branch which leads into the Easterly side of a large branch of Tunkhannock Creek, called Belsey's Brook, or the Painted Post branch & about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the place known by the name of the Painted Post, in the County of Luzerne, Adjoining George Fullerton & others. Surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of Octo<sup>r</sup> 1792, for Sam'l Harris, in pursuance of a Warrt bearing date the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1792. Containing Two hundred Eighty four acres & one hundred & Eighteen perches & the usual allowance of six pr. cent. for Roads &c.
