It Appears by Mr. Jacob Hubers Papers that the above Tract of Land was first Surveyed by Mr. John Jones the 15th Day of November 1769 unto Philip Winter who Hath Purchased the same of Thomas Smith and Company, And the said Philip Winter being so thereof Rightfully Seized Died Intestate, so the said Tract of Land (Together with other Lands) was Legally Adjudged unto his Eldest Son Samuel Winter, who afterwards Sold the same unto him the said Jacob Huber.
