



In pursuance of an Order dated April 1st 1769 N^o. 2808 was Survey'd
for James Hunter the above described Tract of Land Containing Two Hundred
and seventy six acres and twenty nine perches with an allowance propor-
tional to six P Cent Situate on both sides of the 1/4 mile run and both sides
of the Great Road leading from Ligonier to Pittsburgh in Unity Township
Westmoreland County Survey'd Feb^r 24th 1790.

N.B. Sir the above described Tract of Land is said to have been Survey'd
and return'd into the Surveyor Generals office by Mr. Robert McCrea but the
division line between James Hunter & Joseph Hunter not being run agree-
able to the desire of the parties and they wishing to have some little additions
made I have done agreeable to their request and made this note that you
may be the better acquainted the manners in which business has been done
