



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 19th day
of 1st mo. November 1734. The above described tract of land was
surveyed unto John Henry in the Township of Hanover in the County
of Lancaster. Beginning at a White Oak, hence West

by the Settlement of Robert Patrick 122 perches to a small
Black Oak, hence North 10 degrees West by Vacant Land 42 perches
to a Dogwood tree. Hence west 60 perches to a White Oak, hence

Oak, hence North 80 degrees East by the Blue Mountainain
186 perches to a post, hence South 30 degrees east by Vacant
Land 168 perches to a Dogwood. Hence south 10 degrees East
