

On the 1st of October, 1852, the New-England  
Anti-Slavery Society, at its annual meeting, in  
Boston, voted to contribute \$1000 to the Anti-Slavery  
Society of the State of Rhode Island, to be used in  
aiding the colored people of Providence. During the  
first month of November, the Anti-Slavery Society  
of Providence, continuing their contributions, made a sum  
equal to half the allowance of Six Hundred Dollars to the  
Providence Anti-Slavery Society. This is all that we have  
done up to date.
