
Late Peter Overshimer now William Henry Esquire



By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 20th March 1811 Surveyed the 18th September 1811 to Barbara Koechler in trust for the heirs of John Sleppy deceased the above described tract of land situate in Plainfield township Northampton County containing forty three Acres three quarters and the allowance of six P. Cent &c.

John Sleppy built a log house on the land & lived thereon two days & two two nights about 5 or 6 years ago & soon after died and left a widow the above named Barbara & six small children one of which is blind it is said he raised grain thereon

John Freit built a house thereon in February last 15 feet square with a Stone Chimney & lived some time therein the house is now without Cover & no person resides therein it is said he gave up in favor of the chidren of Sleppy Geo Palmer D.S.
