



Situate on Mud Lick Run, a branch of the North Fork of Turkeyfoot—in Turkeyfoot Township Somerset County and Surveyed the 13th day of May 1813. In pursuance of a Warrant granted to John King dated the 27th day of March 1813 by directions of the honorable Board of Property permitting this Warrant to issue ~~to issue~~ to take the whole survey in Lieu of his former Warrant dated 12th September 1812 for 80 a. which was too small to include the Land above represented—The Survey was made by John McLean Esquire late Deputy Surveyor as appears by his Official Draught thereof remaining in my Office & now Certified & Returned the 26th December 1815
