



By VIRTUE of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day of November 1734 Surveyed unto Daniel LeBar a tract of land situate in Newcawissichoppin in the County of Philads Beginning at a post in a line of the German tract thence by other land of sd LeBar South East one hundred and sixty eight perches to a post thence by vacant land North East fifty perches and a half perch to a white oak thence by vac^t land North West one hundred and sixty eight perches to a post in a line of sd German tract thence by the same South West fifty perches and a half perch to ye place of Beginning Containing fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p^t Cent. Surveyed Novem^r 22^d 1734

Now granted to his son Philip LeBar by Warrt dated ye 27th of June 1740 of the right of the adjoining 150^s being also vested in the said Philip LeBar both Returned together ye 28th of June 1740.
