



The Draught of a piece or parcell of Land in the County of Lancaster (part of a Tract of 900 Acres laid out for Adam Gouldney with Allowance of 6 acres to the Hundred for Roads) Situate on a Branch of Tulpehoccoon Creek. Beginning at a white oak thence North East by East by the land of Christopher Stump 132 perches to a white oak thence South East by South by the same land 36 perches to a stone thence North East by the same land 116 perches to a post thence South 5 Degrees West by Leonard Peak 80 perches to a post thence South 73 deg. East 5 per. to a post thence South 21 Degrees East by the said Peak 88 perches to an Ash tree thence South 77 Deg. Easterly by the same 44 per. to a post thence South 35 Degrees West by Andrew Ellik 56 per. to a post thence North 74 deg. West by ye same 123 per. to a post thence West by ye same 40 per. to a Hickory tree thence North 65 Degrees West by the same 106 perches to a white oak thence North 16½ perches to ye place of Begining Containing 144 acres beside the proportion of allowance for Roads &c.
