


Beginning at Maple at foot of Island

& ninety seven perches. Surveyed for A.H. Ludlow in pursuance of  
a Warrant granted to him dated the 24<sup>th</sup> day of January A.D. 1860.  
And in accordance with an agreement between Josiah Hall and  
A.H. Ludlow, dated 23<sup>d</sup> day of July A.D. 1860.  
Witness my hand the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1860.
