



By Virtue of a warrant dated the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1793, and order of Survey rec<sup>d</sup>. the 20<sup>th</sup> of March 1851. Surveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> of March 1851. To Moses William. The above described tract of land situate in Palmyra Township (formerly Northampton) now Pike County, adjoining and on the South East side of land surveyed to the said William, on a small branch of Waller Paupack, containing four hundred and eighty five acres and eighty six perches and the allowance of six per cent for Roads &c.
