



In pursuance of an order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772, a Survey was made on the 3<sup>rd</sup> July following for James Anderson of a certain Lot of Ground, in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland, marked in a General Plan of said Town Number eighty-seven, Containing in Breadth Northward and southward fifty seven feet six inches and in length East and west two hundred and thirty feet, Bounded westward by Broad Way, Northward by Lot Number eighty-six, Eastward by River Alley, and southward by Lot Number eighty-eight. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September 1772, for John Messer, by warrant dated the 24<sup>th</sup> instant.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 1905,
