



Draught of two hundred and forty five acres and sixty one perches of land with six per cent allowance. Situate in Walker township Juniata County being composed of two tracts or surveys to wit. No. 1. being a tract surveyed March 16<sup>th</sup> 1854 On Warrant to William Fiddle dated January 24<sup>th</sup> 1794 for One hundred acres in Mifflin County (now Juniata County) and contains One hundred and ten acres and seventy perches with six per cent allowance. No. 2. is a tract of land situate in Walker township Juniata County (formerly Cumberland County) surveyed on Warrant to Robert Logan August 4<sup>th</sup> 1785<sup>+</sup> and said to contain One hundred and nine acres and seventeen perches with six per cent allowance and resurveyed July 18<sup>th</sup> 1854 on order of Resurvey grante to Samuel Loudenslager & David Aleman and found to contain One hundred and thirty four acres & eighty five perches with six per cent allowance. Surveyed the above into one tract July 18<sup>th</sup> 1854 for David Aleman, Sam<sup>l</sup> Loudenslager Joshua Kauffman, Augustus Jones, Henry Kauffman & James Funt the present owners for the purpose of obtaining a Patent
