



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary's Bearing Date the 8th Day of March An^o. Dom. 1737,
Surveyed on the 19th Day of March 1739. To James Mayes in the Township of Donegal & County
of Lancaster One Hundred & fifty Acres of Land, With the further Addition of Ninety Eight
Acres & the Usual Allowance, Beginning at a Marked Birch tree Standing by the side of
Little Sickasalonge Creek, in the Line of James Mitchel's Land, thence up by the Several
Courses of the s^d Creek 265 perches to a Marked White Oak, thence North 67 Deg. East 25 per
to a post, thence North West 55 per to a white Oak, in the line of John Mcfarlen's Land, thence
South 62 Deg. West 21 per. to a post, thence North 77 deg. West 198 per to a hickery, Cor
ner of Francis Stewart's Land, thence South 10 deg. East 116 per to a Black Oak, thence
South 34 deg East 180 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing in the whole
248 acres & the Allowance of Six p. Cent for Roads &c
It's recited in the prop^rs patent that this Surv^y. was Surveyed by Sa. Blinston - -
Accepted &c. in pursuance of a Warr^t dated the
10th day of October 1739.
