



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the Ninth Day of January Anno Dom. 1736.

A Survey According to the Above Draught Was Made Unto John M^cKown in Hanover Township, in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Post Thence North 12 Degrees West by the Improvement of William Erwin & William Baird 108 perches to a post. Then by ye sd-Baird South 78° West 97 perches to a post. Thence North 12 Degrees West by the Same 110 perches to a Black Oak. Thence North 78 deg. East by James Brown 128 p^{cs}s to a Post. Thence South 12° East by Thomas Bell 12 per. to a post. Then North 78° East by the same 54 perches to a Dog tree. Thence South 12 Degrees East by John Hill's Improvement 44 perches to a Black Oak. Thence North 78 Degrees East by the same 138 perches to a Dog-tree. Thence South 12 Degrees East by the Improvement of James Murray 104 perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence South 78 Degrees West 8 perches to a post. Thence South 12 Deg^{ts} East by the Said-Murray & John Smith 58 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 78 Degrees West by the Said-Smith 215 perches to the place of Beginning & 69 perches Containing Two Hundred & Ninety Seven Acres, beside the Allowance of Six p Cent.
