



By Virtue of a Warrt from the Honrble Proprietaries bearing Date the twenty four  
th Day of May March Anno D/ 1738.

I have Survey'd and Laid Out unto WM Mc Meen in the the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on On the West Side-Susquehanna river Three hundred acres of Land with allowance of Six p. Cent.

Beginning at a Marked-tree Standing by Cone dagwanett Creek Thence South Twenty four Degrees Westerly one hundred and four perches to a White Oak. Thence South One hundred and Eight pches to White Oak. So<sup>th</sup> Seventy Nine Degrees Easterly one hundred and Eight perches to Post. Thence South Thirty three Degrees Easterly One hundred perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence North fifty Six Degrees Easterly one hundred Thirty four pches to a White Oak Standing on the Line of Indian Manner. Thence North Thirty four Degrees Westerly Two hundred & Twenty four perches to a beech by the Said-Creek, then up the same Traversing the several Courses thereof near about One hundred perches to the place of Beginning.
