The Above described Tract of Land was Surveyed to Alexander McCullough, in Hanover Township, in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Post at a Corner of the Land of William Barnard thence North by East by Land settled by James Clark and Thomas Ludington 160 per. to a White Oak. Thence North 88 Deg^s West by said-Ludington and Matthew Gaults Improvements 286 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 5 Deg^s West by ye Improvement of William Cunningham. 160 perches to a post. Thence North 82 Deg^s East by John Gilliland 128 perches to a post Then by William Barnard Nor. by East 3 per. and East by South 144 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Two Hundred and forty Acres and ye Usual^s Allo^s.
