

Situate on the waters of Little Sandy Creek in Wharton township Fayette County and Surveyed the 28th day of August 1832 In pursuance of a Warrant in the hand of William Payton for 135 acres dated the 22th day of March 1832.

There is on this tract a tog house about 10 or 12 acres cleared improxment appears to be 30 years old or upwards.

This Survey contains too much land. Mr. Payton was informed of this, which mould likely prevent its acceptance, but he being willing to pay for the surpluss and the circumstanc- of the land being entirely surrounded by other office rights, and the land which he would throw off in reducing the quantity, being very rough & stony, would, in that case, very probably be lost to the State; he therefore requests me to return it as it is, and hopes it will be accepted F. Lewis, D.5.
