A field said to have been Cleared and Occupied by James Vance about  
two acres part of said field is included in the above Survey as shown  
by the dotted lines north of the line bearing S. 22. W. and is call'd James  
Vance's Improvement said to have Commenc'd in the fall of 1800 and that since  
that time he had raised and taken off said ground two crops of wheat and one  
Crop of Rye.

David Glen claims all the Land as Survey'd in pursuance of the  
aforesaid Warrant by Virtue of James Vance's improvement and Wishes to have  
a hearing at the Board of Property before a patent be issued.
