

Do hereby Certifie That Henry Dawson is Intitled to two hundred and fifty Acres of land in Yohogania County on the Waters of

Redstone ~~Creek~~ to include his Settlement thereon, made in the year 1771. Given under our hands at Cox's fort the 21st day of

January 1780 and in the fourth Year of the Commonwealth.
