

The above described tract of Land, comprehending Nos. 1 & 2 situate in Fannet Township, Franklin County, No. 1 containing fifty one acres, eighty seven perches, of Land, and allowance of six 7/8 Cent for Roads &c was surveyed by Matthew Henderson Esq. formerly a Deputy Surveyor, on the 8th day of February 1791. In pursuance of a Warrant granted to James McConoughy, bearing date the 19th day of October A. D. 1790.

No. 2 Containing Twenty seven acres, eight perches of Land and all of six 7/8 Cent for Roads &c. was surveyed by Matthew Henderson Esq. formerly a Deputy Surveyor, on the 27th day of March A. D. 1793. In pursuance of a warrant granted to James McConoughy, bearing date the 19th of May 1792. all of which, appears by an Official Draft thereof remaining in my Office, which Draft I have examined and find correct.
