

hundred and Eleven Perches and the usual Allowance for Roads Surveyed  
the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March 1805 In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 4<sup>th</sup> day of June  
1762.

the Mouth of Aughwick Creek on finding the Warrant the above blanks
