 April 1769 granted to William Peters Esq<sup>E</sup> for a City Lot  
 (in lieu of a Lot laid out to him on Fourth Street in right  
 of the Original Purchase of John Brothers) Surveyed for the  
 said William Peters Esq<sup>E</sup> on the 12<sup>th</sup>. day of September 1769  
 the said Lot Situate on the West side of Third Street  
 from Delaware Containing in Breadth on said Third -  
 Street 49½ feet and in Length 198 feet Bounded  
 Eastward with Third Street Northward with the Revd  
 Doct<sup>I</sup>. William Smiths Ground and Westward and -  
 Southward with Vacant Ground —  
 Returned into the Secretarys Office the 24<sup>th</sup>. day of Feb-  
 ruary 1770.
