



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Eleventh day of June 1734 Surveyed unto Jacob Button a tract of Land Situate in Newcowisschopp — in the County of Bucks, ^{if part in the County of Philada} Beginning at a post in the German line being a Corner of George Shoemaker's land thence by the same North East one hundred and fifty five perches to a post Thence by Vacant land South East fifty two perches to a hickory Sapling thence by Vacant land South Eighty Two degrees East Thirty Six perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant land South East Eighty four perches to a post thence by Vacant land South West one hundred & seventy seven perches to a post in a line of sd German Tract thence by the same North West one hundred and sixty four perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and sixty two acres with the usual allowance of sixth Cent — Surveyed December 19th 1734.
