



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Fourteenth day of October A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>i</sup> 1733. Surveyed unto Walter Newman a certain tract of Land situate near a branch of Tulpehoccoon Creek, called the Mill Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post in a Line of John Seller's Land thence extending by the same and vacant land North East one hundred & forty six pches & a half to a small hickery marked. Thence by Vacant Land south East one hundred and sixteen pches to another small Hickery marked, south West one hundred & forty six pches & a half to a Spanish oak marked and North West one hundred and sixteen pches to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred acres and the usual allowance for Roads &c.  
Surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Oct<sup>r</sup> A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>i</sup> 1735.
