


FORM NO. I.



In Pursuance of a Warrant from Proprietaries dated the sixth day of November A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>i</sup>. 1734. surveyed unto George Priegel a certain tract of Land. Situate on a Branch of Tulpehoccoon - Called the Mill Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post at a corner of John Seller's Land in a Line of David Jones's Land thence extending by said Seller's Land North East by East half a point Easterly, one hundred sixty three pches & a half to a black oak at another corner of sd Seller's Land, thence by Vacant Land North North West half a point Westerly one hundred & twenty five pches to a post in a line of David Evans's Land thence by the same South West by West half a point Westerly one hundred & seventy six pches to a post, thence by Vacant Land and David Jones's Land, South East by South one hundred twenty five pches & a half to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred & twenty five acres and the allowance of six p. ct.
