


VACANT LAND



Land of Peter Witezer.

The above Tract lies 45 Miles from ye Town of Reading, between ye Broad Mountain & ye Tuscarora Ridges, about Six Miles west of ye Schuylkill Waggon Road to Shamokin. At least Seventy Acres of most excellent Meadow may be made on this Tract, the chief of which may be watered; - and what adds much to the value of this Meadow is the great Easiness of the clearing, - the Meadow is very rich, & the Bushes generally hazel, the Upland is good Wheat-Land, White Oak & Black Oak Timber. - tis the best adapted for keeping Stock, that can be; as there is a very extensive Range which mostly always remain unconfin'd.
