



A Draught of a Tract of Land, Surveyed the 3<sup>d</sup> day of June 1802 for Andrew Russell, by virtue of his Warrant, for 140 acres of land, dated the seventeenth day of May, in the year 1802, situate on the north branch of Chartiers Creek in the county of Washington, adjoining Lands of James McElroy, Robert Ackleson, James Irvine, & Robert McCloskey, in the Township of Chartiers, including his improvement, containing one hundred and forty eight acres, and one hundred and twenty one perches, together with the usual allowance of six P. cent for Roads,
