



In Pursuance of an Act of Gen.<sup>l</sup> Assembly of the State of Penn<sup>a</sup> Passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of Febr<sup>y</sup> 1785 entitled "an Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands promis.<sup>d</sup> the Troops of this Common-Wealth" and by order of the Surv.<sup>r</sup> General with the approbation of the Hon.<sup>l</sup> The Executive Council, I have Survey'd on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of ~~Febr~~ August 1785, the above described Tract of two hundred Acres of Land and Allowance of Six P.C.<sup>t</sup> for Roads &c. Nº DCCCLXXIX situate in District Nº4 on the West side of the Allegany river in the County of Westmoreland.
