



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Penn.<sup>a</sup> Passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled "an Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Common-Wealth," and by Order of the Surveyor General with the Approbation of the Hon.<sup>l</sup> the Executive Council, I have Survey'd on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September 1785 the above discribed Tract of ix hundred acres of Land and Allow.<sup>o</sup> of Six P.C<sup>t</sup> for Roads &c. N<sup>o</sup> DCCCXXII situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 4 on the West side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
